Services to people with developmental disabilities and their families

FAST FACTS

- ⇐ Approximately 3,431 people in Lane County experience a developmental disability.*
- ⇐ Services to people with developmental disabilities contribute more than \$ 26 million dollars per year to the local economy through jobs, wages, and the purchase of services and supplies in Lane County.

Adults with Developmental Disabilities

1,241 receive Service Coordination/Case Management.

486 receive 24-hour Comprehensive Services including foster care, residential services, and comprehensive in-home supports.

503 receive Community Support/Brokerage Services (Staley Agreement).

178 are known to be waiting for services.

Children (0-18) with Developmental Disabilities

376 receive Service Coordination/Case Management.

61 receive 24-hour Comprehensive Services including foster care, residential, and comprehensive in-home supports.

16 receive Intensive In-Home Supports, which includes children who require significant supports because of behavior or medical needs.

68 receive Family Support Services, which include respite care or other assistance to help children in family homes.

Approximately 247 families are eligible but not receiving Family Support Services.

These figures include only those individuals and families who have been identified by DD Services. Many eligible people do not seek county DD services for a variety of reasons including personal choice, lack of awareness, waitlists, and because at times only crisis services were available. Numbers may be duplicated, as individuals may be receiving some services and on waitlists for other services.
